Yards ahead with upgrades to livestock facilities

Guyra and Armidale saleyards are due to receive major multi-million dollar upgrades which will result in more modern livestock yards, improved truck driver and agent facilities and better water security at both locations.

Armidale Regional Council (ARC) has secured funding of \$9.7 from Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund, co-funded by the Australian and NSW Governments and the official sod turning on the project took place at the Guyra Saleyards on Tuesday August 6th.

“This project, while providing a much needed upgrade for the yards, will have significant economic benefits to our region with agriculture identified as the third biggest industry in our region,” said ARC Mayor Sam Coupland

“The project will replace and extend key infrastructure and amenities at each location and in turn support the recovery of the key agricultural sector in our region.

“Not only will these vital upgrades help boost our local economy and create industry opportunities, they also highlight Council’s efforts to minimise environmental impact and promote sustainability.”

Member for New England Barnaby Joyce joined Mayor Coupland for the ceremonial turning of the sod at the Guyra Saleyards with

work expected to start in the next fortnight.

Mr Joyce said it is incredibly important if you are on the land to be able to get transparency of sale. “Saleyards are still vitality important for bringing the commerce into town and to ensure producers can get the best price for animals,” Mr Joyce said.

“The people who come into the sale also support local businesses while they are there and it is part and parcel of getting money into

our rural towns.

Sam Sewell from the New England Livestock Agents association said that the upgrade will bring the local facilities in line with the industry standard.

“It puts us in line to be competitive in the market place and to offer a workplace that is more functional and efficient,” he said.

“It also provides the opportunity for people of the district to have their lambs displayed in a state of the art facility and for the greater

community to know there is no better pace to send their lambs.”

Work at the Guyra Saleyards will include demolition, removal and waste disposal of timber sheep yards, staged construction of steel sheep yards, upgrading stock watering system in sequence with yard construction, road upgrade around the yards and relocating cattle yards.

Her earliest memories revolve around food, helping her grandmother prepare meals for the family and her first job was working in a little café in Dorriggo where she says she just loved preparing food and interacting with the customers.

Jess has been in and out of the hospitality industry ever since and most recently has built up a following for her mobile catering business which services functions such as weddings, parties, and events. She has also opened her food van from home on a semi regular basis and often had customer lining up down the street to taste her delights.

Jess said she is more than a little bit excited to take the next step which is a shopfront where she can service her customers on a regular basis. Identifying that night time options in town were limited, she will initially open evenings Wednesday to Sunday from 4pm to 8pm, closing later on Friday and Saturday nights.

The opening of the diner is an extension of her business and she will continue to operate her mobile catering with the help of her loyal staff and will look to add extra employees to service both businesses. She will also continue to cater at the saleyards in Armidale and Guyra

Jess said she is looking forward to seeing her customers on a more regular basis and the feedback so far has been extremely encouraging. She will open the doors for the first time on this Friday August 9th.

Butchery changes hands

Robert Sisson has this week gone from employee to becoming the boss of his own business. He has commenced ownership of Guyra's only butcher shop, re-branding as Sisson Family Meats. Robert is no stranger to the business having worked with previous owner Cody Campbell for four years.

It is a big step for Robert at just 19 years of age, but he believes he is up for the challenge. Cody will be assisting in the transition why he learns the ropes, particularly the business side of things. He also has his mum Tania on board to assist him behind the scenes with the running of the shop.

old and new customers to the shop.

In his first week of business Robert has been encouraged by the support he has received. As well as his retail customers the butchery services a number of business customers in town as well as being the supplier to an Armidale restaurant, providing plenty of work for him and his three employees.

Among the challenges he will face is the current cost of living crisis. At the moment he has noticed that some customers are putting cheaper cuts such as mince and sausages at the top of the shopping list. Robert is happy to discuss bulk packages to suits your needs and to help keep costs down. Value added products and pre-prepared dishes are also popular and a good way of getting value for money.

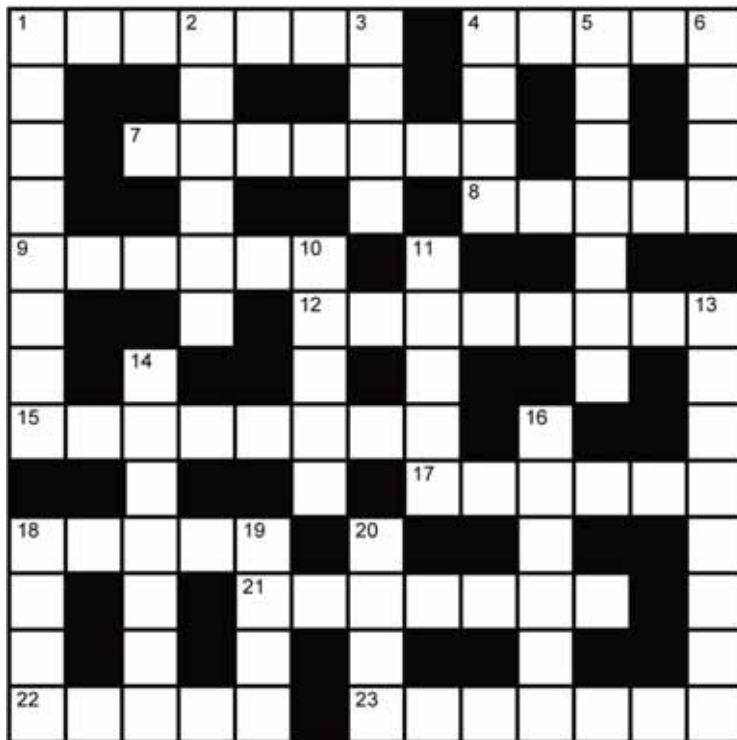

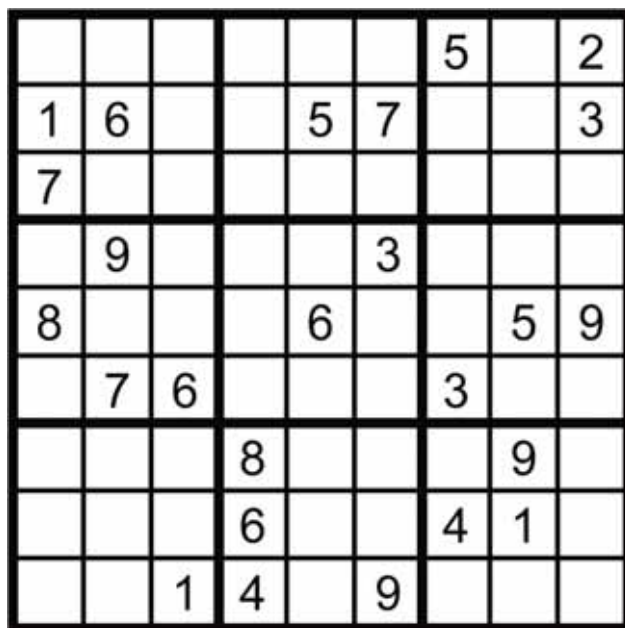

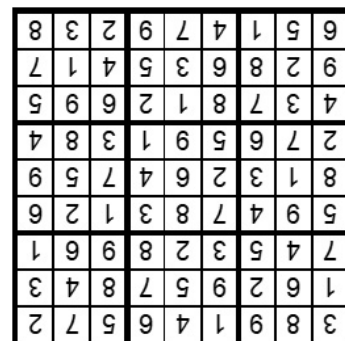

Each speaker shared personal stories and valuable insights into mental health and well-being, emphasizing the importance of community support.

Casey Chard spoke on behalf of the Kayne Wells family.

"While organising Wellsy's funeral, we knew we wanted to give back to this amazing community that brought us much strength during such a difficult time," Casey said.

"We also knew that we wanted to raise awareness and support

Rural Market Reports

Armidale Cattle Sale

August 1st - Yarding 870 down 190 on the previous sale. There was a reduction in supply with wet weather over the weekend contributing. The quality of the offering was very mixed with a greater percentage of plain and secondary quality cattle penned. There was a full field of buyers in attendance.

Demand was high through most categories. Restocker demand was high on the back of the recent rain event with a bumper Spring almost assured. This resulted in the light and medium weight yearling steers selling to a dearer trend with most of the good quality lots showing considerable improvement.

Heavy weight feeder steers

also attracted strong competition to also show a dearer trend.

Restockers were also active in the heifer classes as were feedlotter, trends dearer. There were limited supplies of well finished heifers suitable to the trade, no comparison from the last sale available.

There were too few good quality grown steers to quote with the majority down on quality and falling into the manufacturing steer category. They sold strongly given the quality on display.

There was less competition on the well finished grown heifers with the market easing. A strong cow market saw trends dearer with the heavyweights improving by as much as 13c/kg.

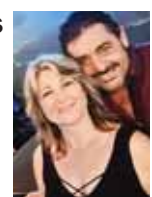
