# Funding boost for sporting star

Guyra's Charlie Ward is one of five sporting stars who will receive \$2000 each to support their Olympic dreams thanks to local non profit HealthWISE and the Northern Inland Academy of Sport (NIAS).

The Active Champions Fund seeks to assist rural athletes with the costs of competing at a high level as they work to qualify for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

According to the Australian government, only 2% of teenagers between 13 and 17 get the recommended amount of physical activity a day.

"It's champions like you who can stand up and show others the way," HealthWISE executive manager of strategy Sally Urquhart told recipients at the scholarship presentation on February 12th.

"As a health organisation, we recognise the benefits of a healthy lifestyle and the impact it has on our physical and mental wellbeing.

"Regular activity strengthens the heart, boosts immunity, improves mental health and helps to build lifelong habits of wellness."

NIAS CEO Shona Eichorn said the two organisations share their values and the goal of promoting healthier lifestyles across the region. As parents, Ms Eichorn and



HealthWISE CEO Fiona Strang recognised the investment required from families of rural athletes.

Guyra's Charlie Ward was "stoked" to be selected to support her dual loves of clay target shooting and equestrian.

Charlie represented Australia in China for dressage and showjumping last year, and enjoyed going from underdog status to becoming the Australian National Ladies Champion (12 guage) at the Australian Clay Target Association's Down the Line Championships. She's confident in her shooting skills and has the Brisbane Olympics in her sights.

Other recipients were Kootingal pole vaulter Teddy Hampton, Calala hockey player Archie Clarke, Tamworth tennis player Orlando York and Tamworth cyclist Benjamin Shaw.

"I hope the scholarships will enhance your ability to access training

and competitions, and to continue to strive to be the best version of you - athletically, but also personally," Ms Urquhart told the athletes.

The Active Champions Fund is part of the HealthWISE gift fund, which has supported community activities promoting health and wellbeing every year since 2018. Last year the fund helped nine

childcare centres establish kitchen gardens to teach youngsters the value of fresh vegetables.





# Hospital auxiliary hands over new equipment for Guyra MPS

The Guyra Hospital Auxiliary are a small group of volunteers who work with the staff at the Guyra Multi-Purpose Health Service (MPS) to provide items such as medical equipment, patient comfort items, and items that are used for all general health care needs.

Fundraising efforts by the Hospital Auxiliary, primarily from regular street stalls, has raised enough money to purchase some extra items for the MPS.

They have arranged for the purchase of four padded shower chairs, four foot stools and four television sets for the benefit of patients and staff.

The total value of the donated items is \$7500 and the purchase would not have been possible without community support of regular street stalls conducted by the auxiliary.

Hospital Auxiliary President Di Burey said that with the dwindling number of members in the group all the effort falls on just a few shoulders.

"More members are needed to continue our fundraising for the hospital and they would be most welcome," Di said. "I would like to thank the Guyra community for their support."

# Tips to help keep pets safe during firework displays

Fireworks are planned for around 8pm at the Guyra Show and while they are a welcome attraction for humans, the same isn't true for our furry friends. Just like thunderstorms, the loud, unexpected noise of fireworks can cause extreme distress for our pets.

Here are some tips to keep your pets comfortable:

- If you can, stay home to be with your pet and try to keep them secured indoors. Alternatively, you could consider asking a friend, family member or pet sitter to be around if your animal has a particularly difficult time with fireworks.
- Ensure you have provided your dogs and cats with everything they need during the day in the lead-up to any fireworks.
  - Provide access to any areas your dog or cat will

want to hide

- Take measures to reduce the impact of flashing lights and noise such as closing curtains and blinds and providing some background noise.
- Play canine or feline-specific calming soundtracks or leave the television or radio on to distract from the sound of the fireworks.
- Use canine or feline synthetic pheromone products in their resting area to provide reassurance and encourage a sense of calm.
- Ensure your pet has a microchip with up-to-date details and an ID tag, as pets could potentially flee and escape your property in an attempt to avoid the noise of the fireworks.

# 22nd New England and North West Landcare Adventure

Local community organisation GWYMAC (Gwydir and Macintyre Resources Management Committee) is preparing to host the 2025 New England and North West Landcare Adventure, on 7th and 8th March at Inverell.

The two-day event, themed, 'Nurturing Nature - Cultivating Tomorrow' is designed to inspire and connect landholders, environment enthusiasts, and community members to facilitate thriving, sustainable communities in the region.

The Adventure offers a dynamic program of expert talks, immersive tours, and opportunities to network with like-minded individuals.

On Day Two, participants can choose between two immersive field trips:

• The Rehydration and Regeneration Tour will explore on-site

projects in the Swanbrook catchment led by Peter Hazel (Mulloon Institute), Andrew Walsh (NTLLS), and Sarah Fea (Soils for Life).

• Our Environment Tour includes with a bird walk along Copeton Dam's northern foreshore, a wildlife photography session, native tree identification and eucalypt insights, a presentation on native grain flours and bush tucker and a native flower arranging demonstration.

The Landcare networks of the region have taken take turns since 2000 to host the New England North West Landcare Adventure annually or biennially and usually attracts between 100-150 farmers and community members.

# AGM coming up for Guyra ratepayer group

The Save and Grow Guyra Ratepayers Incorporated (Sand-GRI) will hold their annual general meeting next week.

The meeting comes amid fresh approaches by Snowy Valleys and Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Councils to push ahead with demerger plans.

It also follows an admission by Premier Chris Minns in State Parliament last week that amalgamations which took place in 2016 were 'a bloody disgrace'.

The Premiers remarks were in response to a question from Shadow Minister for Local Government Wendy Tuckerman asking the Premier what action the Government is taking to stop "ridiculous rate rises".

SandGRI has been vocal in the past about their desire to re-establish a Guyra based council and

agree with the sentiment expressed by the NSW Premier.

"This could be our greatest chance to convince the Boundaries Commission and the Minister for Local Government that communities would be financially better off operating as separate identities," SandGRI Chairman Rob Lenehan said.

"This has always been a proven point, supported by world leading economists, auditors, consultants and ratepayers."

This coming Wednesday February 26th, Save and Grow Guyra Ratepayers Incorporated will hold their Annual General meeting at the Guyra Bowling and Recreation Club.

The meeting will commence at 6pm.Mr Lenehan said this will be a great opportunity to learn more about the organisation.





Local shows are so vital for small towns and bring people together in all different aspects, whether it is to enjoy the livestock competitions, shearing, the rides, food, arts and crafts or just to get together with mates.

The Long Lunch on Saturday promises to be a highlight of the weekend with a twocourse meal and all proceeds going directly back into the Show Society.

Shows keep traditions alive and bring the community together. They are also great for the local economy and the Guyra show is a fantastic annual event. I hope it is a huge success and look forward to it!

### Crime

Youth crime has dominated community concerns in recent weeks. It is time for the NSW Government to start listening to people on the ground. They should be focusing on protecting the community and innocent victims of crime.

Proper legislation is how to fix crime across regional NSW. The current bail laws

are failing, and we need stronger measures to ensure that the harm done to victims takes precedence over the offender's age.

I have given notice of the introduction of the Regional Youth Crime Reform Bill 2025 to Parliament. The Bill seeks to make three straightforward, yet significant changes, to address the ongoing youth crime problems in regional NSW.

The three proposed changes include:

- 1. Reversal of *doli incapax*.
- 2. To remove the loophole in section 22c of the Bail Act so courts, including the Supreme Court, are not permitted to grant bail to serious juvenile repeat offenders.
- 3. To require courts to place greater weight on the impact on the victim when sentencing an offender.

Those of us in rural towns deserve to feel safe. Enough is enough.


Another busy week for everyone. Lots of score cards in this week. Great to see.
